1. When does team registration open up?

January 1, 2020

2. Is there an age range recommended / required for FLL Jr. participation?

FLL Jr. was designed for children, in grades K- 4, ages 6 – 10 years old.

3. Do participants of each team have to attend the same school?

No, teams are not designated by school. While creating a team of your classmates is a great way to assemble a team, you are not limited to just your classmates. You can invite your friends, neighbors, fellow troop members, sports team members, etc. to join your team. Just keep in mind that teams should be 4 - 6 team members.

4. What if I am not able to assemble a team, but would still like to participate?

I am willing to be placed with an existing team. I may not be placed with a team, and accept the risk of not finding a team before the FLL, Jr Expo. After signing up, I will receive notification once my child is added to a team and payment is expected at that time. Sign up to be on the waitlist here.

5. Do coaches have to be parents or can they be teachers or other adult volunteers?

Coaches can be any adult volunteer who complete the consent & release form and have passed the background check.

6. Where will the weekly meetings / building sessions take place?

As a team, you can decide where and when to hold the weekly meetings. Teams often enjoy meeting at a team member's house or at school (with the school's permission). We suggest 8-12 sessions prior to the Expo.

7. What are we required to do during each weekly building meeting?

Your coach will be provided with a guide which outlines the weekly building activities. In addition, each team member will receive an Engineering Workbook that guides you through each lesson. You can work at your own pace as long as the final project is completed by the Expo date, April 25, 2020.

8. Who is permitted to participate in the Expo?

Participants county-wide are encouraged to participate. This is a community event and we hope to see teams represented from all the cities in our county, various school districts, diverse groups, etc.

9. Are scholarships available?

Scholarships are available on a needs-basis. Please contact the FLL Jr chair at iris.ilao@kidstream.org for more information. Scholarships are limited and will be honored on a first come, first served basis.

10. How can I sign up to be a volunteer at the Expo?
